

HOW TO RESPOND TO IMMIGRATION OFFICERS ON CAMPUS:

For UCLA Students

IF you or another student are approached by an immigration officer who has entered the UCLA campus or other UCLA property to execute a federal removal order, THEN you should:



1. REMAIN CALM

and know that there is campus support for these encounters.



2. REQUEST

the official's:

- a) Name;
- b) Identification number;
- c) Agency affiliation
- d) Warrant or court order



3. RIGHTS

Under the 4th amendment, you have the right against search and seizure without a signed judicial warrant and under the 5th amendment you have the right to remain silent.



4. CALL

UC Immigrant Legal Services at (424)832-0977 and explain the encounter with the Immigration Officer whether it is you or for someone else on campus

Can anyone access any part of campus as a public institution?

No. UCLA has many limited access spaces. Faculty and staff are not required to affirmatively assist immigration authorities. Permission to enter spaces such as dining facilities, clinical areas, UCLA housing and administrative offices can only be given by UCLA Campus Counsel.

Will UCPD enforce Immigration laws?

No. In compliance with UC Office of the President, "UC Police will not undertake joint efforts with federal immigration enforcement authorities to investigate, detain or arrest individuals for violation of federal immigration law."
